

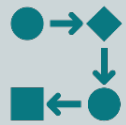

What Does “Over-Dimension” Mean?

Exceeding limits established in Oregon Revised Statutes or Oregon Administrative Rules.

- More than 8’6” in width.
- More than 14’0” in height.
- Over legal axle weights or group axle weights.
- Over the length limits (trailer and/or overall), as shown on various route maps.

Types Of OD Permits

- Continuous Trip Permits (CTP) – up to certain dimensions, valid for 365 days.
- Single-Trip Permits (STP) – typically exceeds dimensions or routes allowed on annual permits, valid for 10 days.
- ~70,000 STPs issued.
- ~60,000 CTPs issued.
- ~46,000 phone calls.
- OD Permit Unit includes
 - 23 staff members,
 - 17 of which are focused on STP issuance.



Single-Trip Permit Issuance

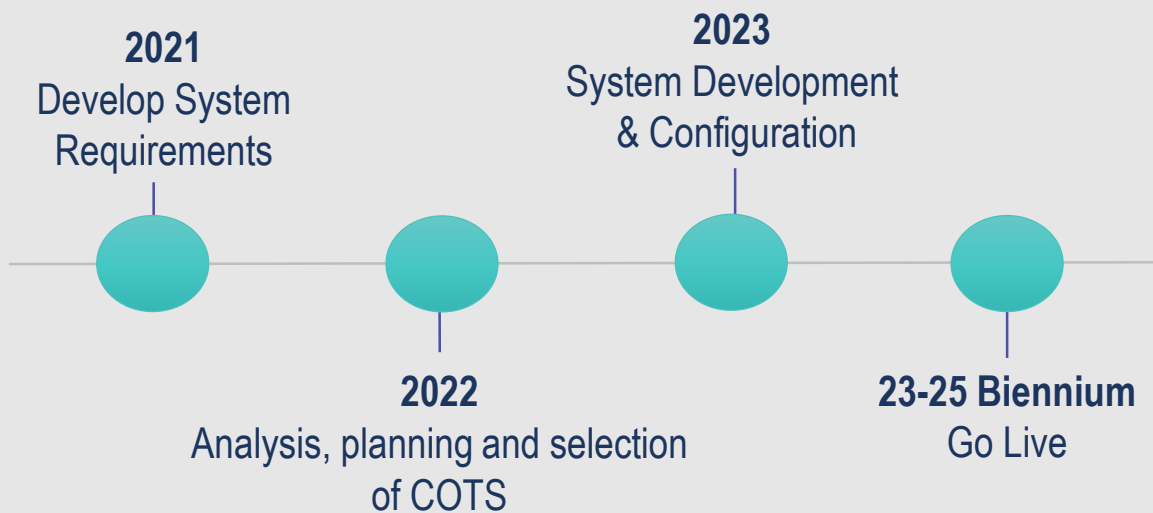
All permits are issued through a Mainframe interface.

- COBOL.
- No capacity for current (or future) improvements.
- Limitations with the interface.
- Limitations with reporting.

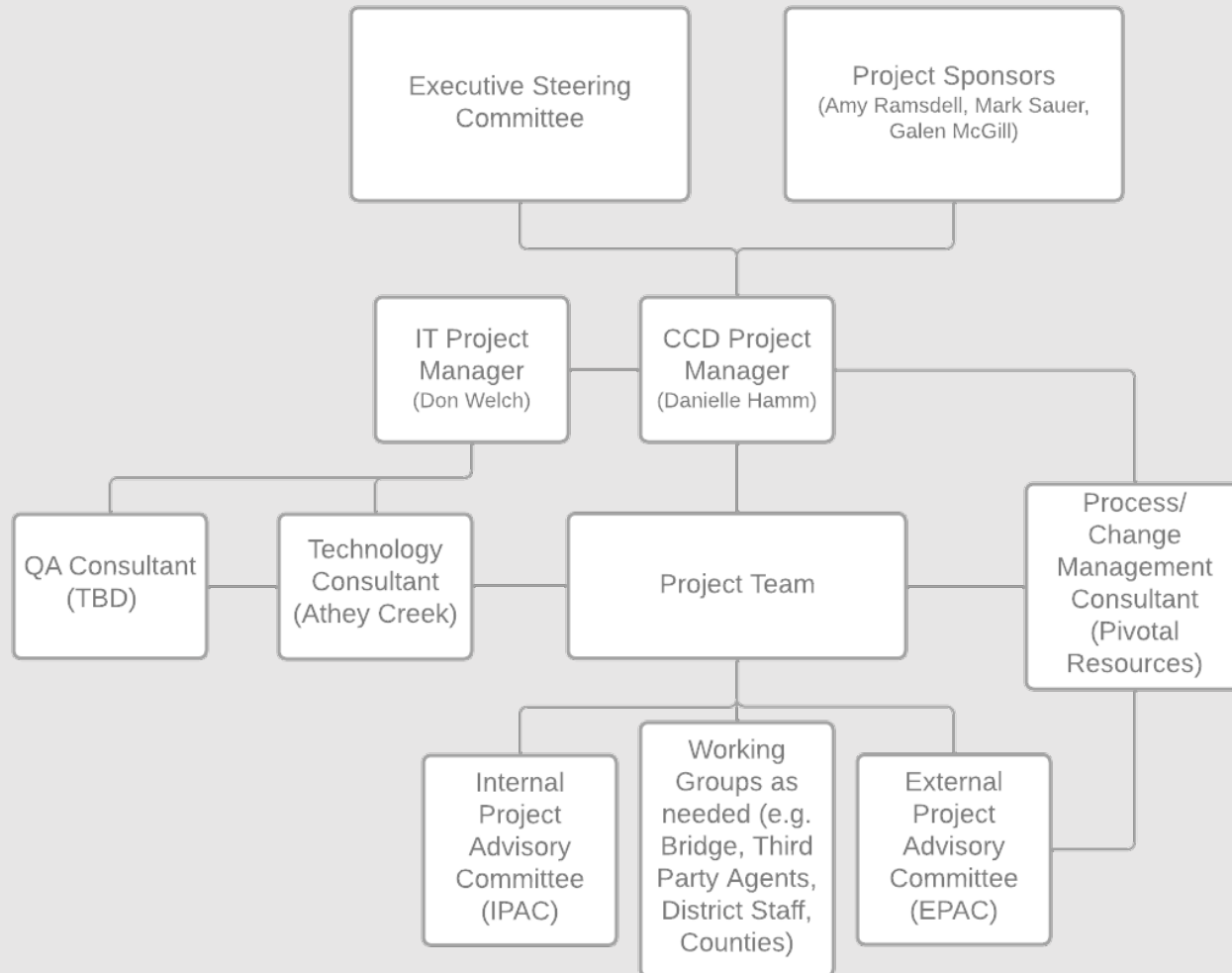


Project Support and Timeline

- Transformational Project
 - Included in ODOT's Strategic Action Plan
 - Officially approved by DAS/Office of the State CIO
 - Goal: invest in technology to improve transportation services and operations throughout Oregon.
- Join 43 other states that have implemented similar systems

Detailed analysis of specific aspects of OD permitting/routing that may need change to fully realize the benefits of a new system

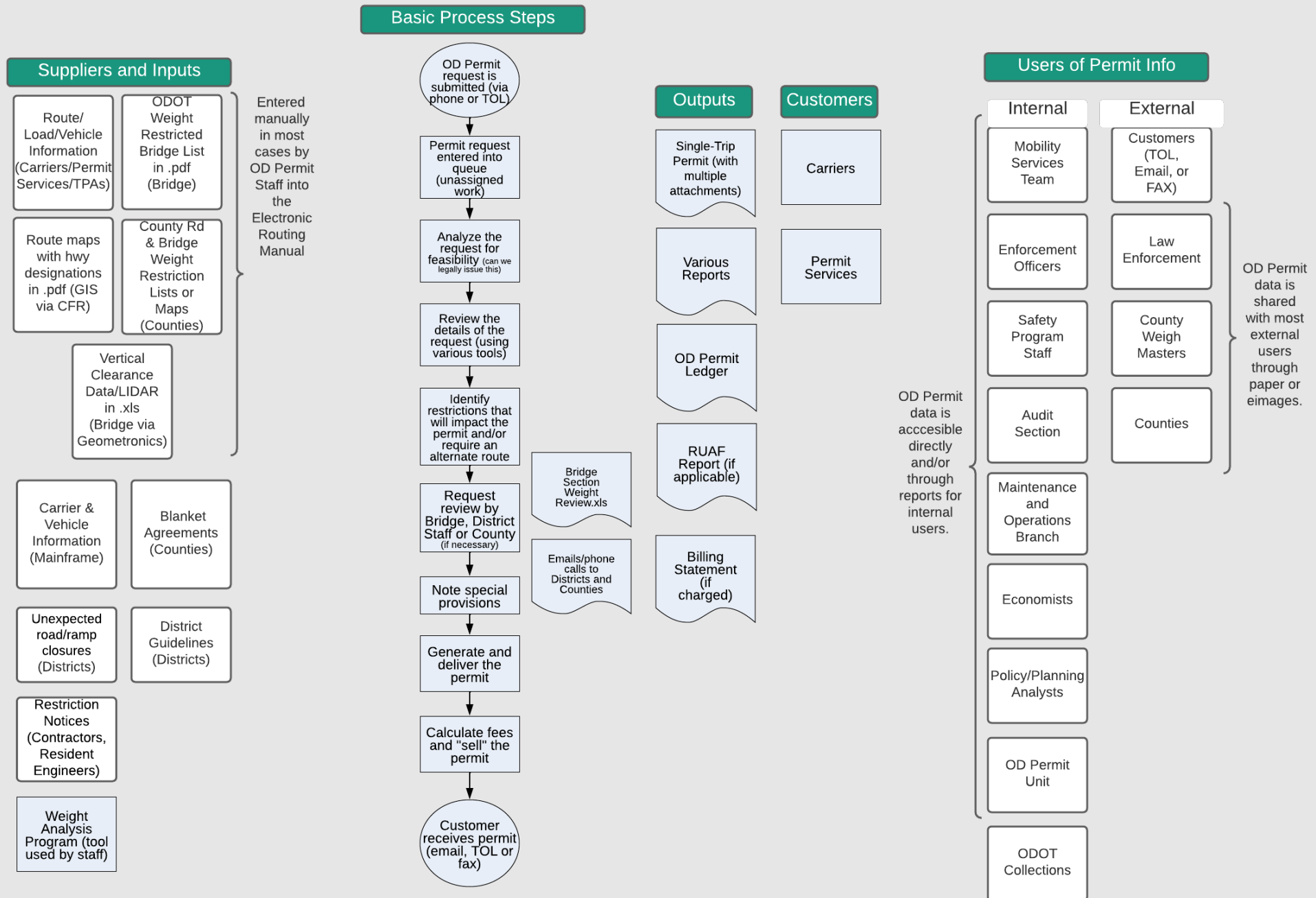


Completed a risk assessment and completed other critical project documentation required by Enterprise Information Services (EIS)

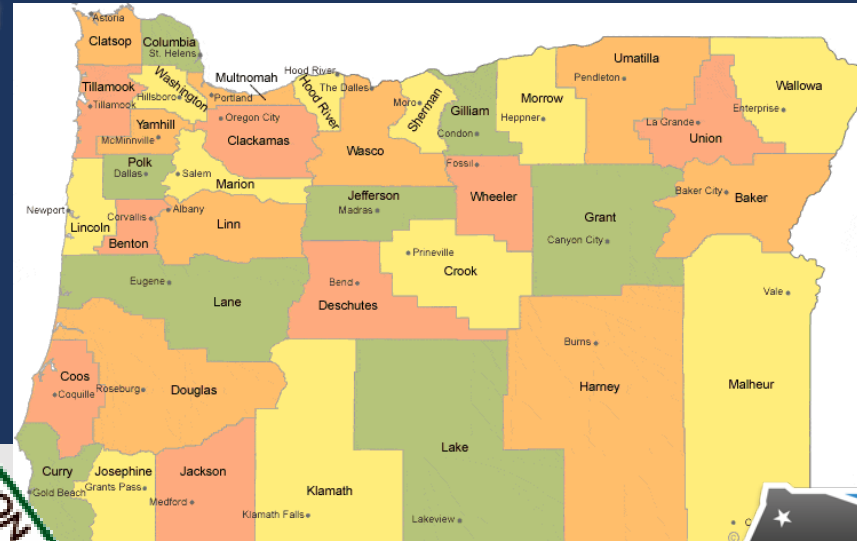


Launched internal and external websites to keep interested parties up to date
